The information enclosed in this report reflect our students results on administration of the Smarter Balanced Assessment Program. In the past you have seen school ranked on a scale of 1 through 5 based on test results, percentage of student tested, graduation rate, and attendance. However this year there is no ranking applied to the school by the Oregon Department of Education. Echo School District on average out performed the state average and like school size average in all areas except in math. Our 5 year school completion rate of 100% is above the state average, along with nearly perfect participation rate (% of students who took the state assessment), and high student attendance rate. You can also see how our students on a whole scored in comparison to the state average and schools our size. In English Language Arts we are above the state average and school of our size, while in math we are slightly below the state average and schools our

same size. Over all Echo School District received rating of 4 (out of 5) in Academic Achievement and 5 (out of 5) in Academic Growth and Graduation . What we promise to you is we will continue to improve as educators and continue to do our very best to provide your child the best possible quality education we can.

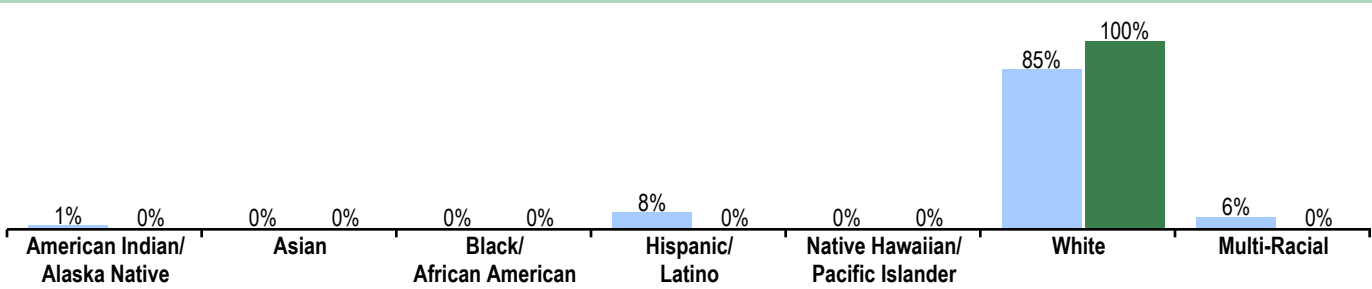

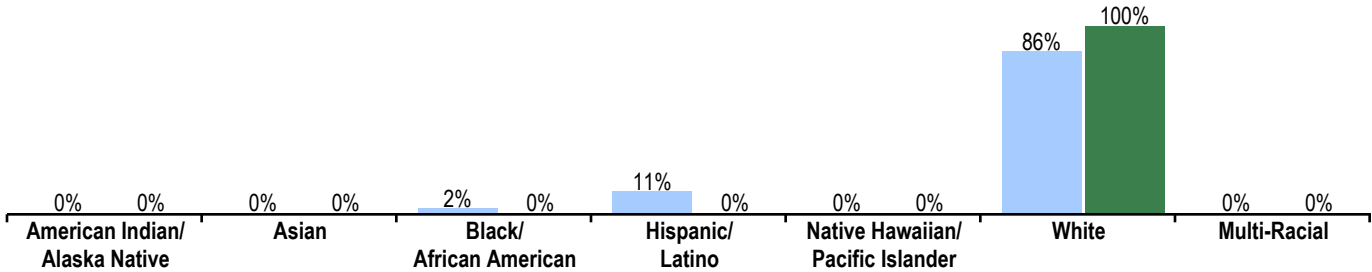
RACE/ETHNICITY OF STUDENTS AND STAFF 2015-16

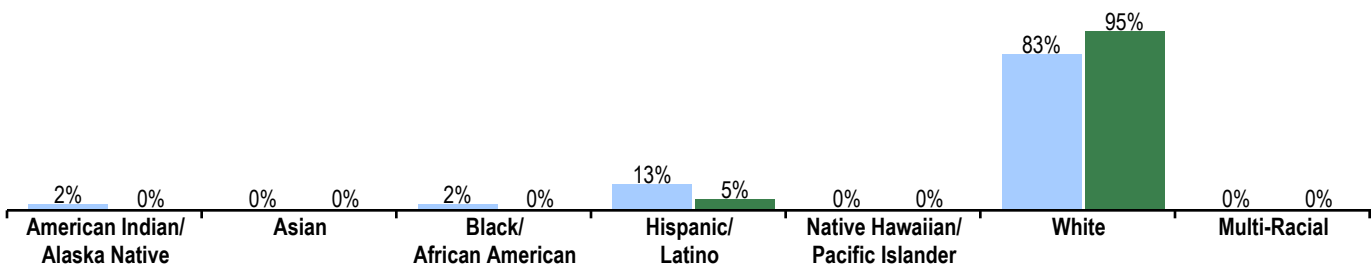

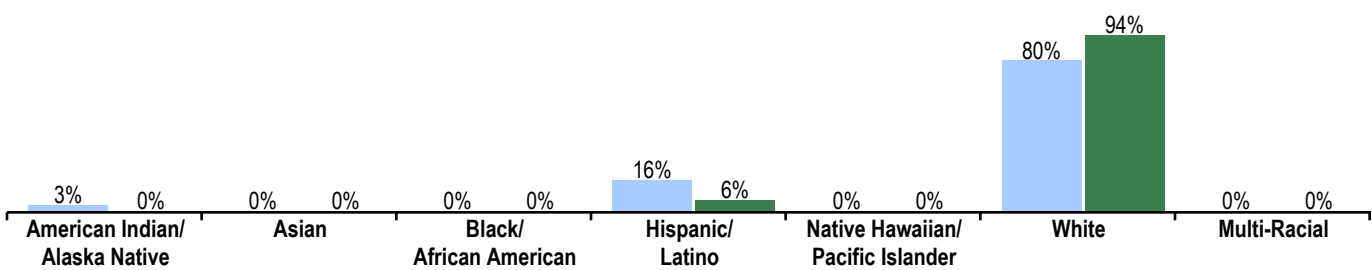
Grades 4-5
